## City Council announces £100m investments



Derby's Council House

Derby City Council Chief Executive Adam Wilkinson committed to making regeneration a key corporate theme for the Authority's future activities to a packed Innes England Market Inside breakfast event at Pride Park Stadium.

He backed this by announcing £100m of investments to be made by the City Council over the coming years including £40m for the construction of the refurbished Council HQ and £50m for the new leisure strategy (itself to include a Velodrome and 50m swimming pool). He hoped soon to be able to launch a new £10m Regeneration Fund to help move some key projects forward in the city as well as stressing the real drive to move forward on Becketwell.

He assured the audience that the public sector was looking to ensure its assets are used effectively and the city was working with local and national public partners through the new Derby Property Alliance.

## Rolls-Royce reports record year



Rolls-Royce has reported record results for 2009, with an order book of £58.3bn, up from £55.5bn in 2008, and profit rising from £880m to £915m over the same period.

Sir John Rose, Chief executive, said: "Rolls-Royce has delivered a solid set of results despite difficult trading conditions. This demonstrates the resilience of our business. Our record order book, the breadth of the portfolio across all four sectors, our strong balance sheet and the early action we have taken to reduce costs will enable us to manage short-term difficulties and deliver long-term growth."

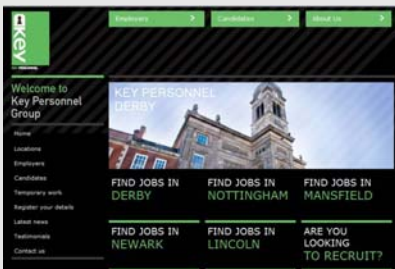
