Turkish delight for Rolls-Royce



Derby aero-engine maker Rolls-Royce has won a \$470m order for Trent engines to power seven aircraft from Turkish Airlines (Turk Hava Yollari).

The order, for Trent 700EP engines for Airbus A330 aircraft, is part of the Turkish flag carrier's strategy to expand its fleet and improve its economics, efficiency and environmental performance. Aircraft deliveries will start in 2010 and includes long-term service support.

Candan Karlitekin, Chairman Turkish Airlines said: "Turkish Airlines passengers will enjoy a great service with great engines on wing. We envisage a bright future for THY and Rolls-Royce has shown a real interest and commitment in contributing to this."
