Rolls-Royce CEO Sir John Rose tops the list at number 7 quickly followed by Peter Gadsby (pictured left) at 18 and Emda Chairman (and ex Toyota MD) Bryan Jackson at 26.

MP for Derby North Bon Laxton is a newcomer at 45 as is Cityscape CEO John Cadwallader at 52. Both John Kirkland and Marketing Derby's own John Forkin are in for a third year running (62 and 70 respectively) and the Cathedral Quarter Hotel's owner James Blick completes the set at 81.

The list is led by two RDA chiefs, Advantage West Midlands Mick Laverty and EMDA's Jeff Moore.

Rolls-Royce secure NZ deal

Derby aero-engine maker Rolls-Royce has signed a deal to supply engines for additional Boeing 787 Dreamliner aircraft ordered by Air New Zealand.

The deal is for Trent 1000 engines to power four firm Boeing 787 orders, with an option on a further eight. Air New Zealand already has an order for Trent 1000s on four aircraft. The engine has been designed and developed at Rolls-Royce's Sinfin site in Derby.

Jim Sheard, Rolls-Royce senior vice president for Asia Pacific and Africa, said: "I am delighted that Air New Zealand has confirmed its commitment to Trent 1000 technology."
